

Friday, April 17 - Day 1 - DEPART USA - Today, we depart Chicago for our overnight flight to Warsaw. We enjoy inflight movies, dinner, and breakfast while aloft. (D,B)

Saturday, April 18 - Day 2 - WARSAW -We arrive early this afternoon at Okecie International Airport, Warsaw. Upon arrival we are greeted by our Tour Manager and board our motor coach to begin our orientation sightseeing tour of Warsaw, including a drive through the city center, passing the Warsaw Uprising Museum, the former Ghetto area with the Memorial of the Ghetto Heroes, the Memorial of the Warsaw Uprising, the Royal Route, and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Afterwards we celebrate Mass at our hotel, next we enjoy our "welcome" dinner and overnight at our hotel. (D)

Sunday, April 19 - Day 3 - WARSAW -

Today, we start our day with Mass at St. Jacob's Church. This is where Jesus said to St. Faustina: "It's here I called you, and not elsewhere." We visit Old Town, where each historic building has been painstaking and lovingly reconstructed after the destruction during WWII, we also visit St. John the Baptist Cathedral, and Saint Stanislaus Kostka Church and the Shrine of Blessed Jerzy Popiełuszko. We break for lunch on our own and then continue the city tour heading to Lazienki Park to view Chopin's Monument. We depart to Niapokalanow, home of the monastery built by St. Maximilian Kolbe. While there we also visit the shrine of Our Mary

Immaculate, which houses an adoration chapel which claims to be the most viewed perpetual adoration on the internet! This evening, we enjoy a special dinner with a Polish folklore show. We conclude our day with our overnight in Warsaw. (B,D)

Monday, April 20 – Day 4 – WARSAW/ CZESTOCHOWA/AUSCHWITZ/

KRAKOW - This morning, we board our motor coach for a two-hour ride to Czestochowa, where we make our way to the monastery complex of Jasna Gora to visit this famous Marian Shrine. Jasna Gora consists of a Gothic/Baroque church, a Baroque monastery and fortress. This is where the miraculous icon of Our Lady of Czestochowa, "The Black Madonna," has been preserved. We tour this shrine and celebrate Mass while there. We break for lunch on our own before continuing with our visit to Auschwitz/Birkenau, site of one of the most infamous death camps, where a million and a half Jews died at the hands of the Nazis during WWII, including St. Maximilian Kolbe, whose cell is still there! We will take some personal time for quiet prayer and reflection. We continue to Krakow for dinner and overnight at our hotel. (B,D)

Tuesday, April 21 - Day 5 - KRAKOW -

Today, following Mass, we visit Wawel Hill and its famous Wawel Castle. Built in the 13th century, it is one of the largest remaining castles in all of Poland. As a home to numerous kings, it has been rebuilt many times over the past seven centuries and now houses significant artifacts to Poland's past as it is now a national museum recognized by UNESCO.



We enjoy a walking tour of the Old Town, visiting some of the architectural and historic treasures that make up this wonderful old city. We view the Town Hall Tower, erected during the 13th century, Cloth Hall, located on the same site since the 14th century, St. Mary's Church, where one of the towers serves as a platform for Krakow's bugle call, the Hejnal, and Jagellonian University, one of Europe's oldest schools, which has a room devoted to Copernicus. We break for lunch on our own with time for shopping in the Market area. In the afternoon we continue to Kazimierz the historic Jewish district of the city. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Wednesday, April 22 - Day 6 – KRAKOW/LAGIEWNIKI/ NOWA HUTA/WIELICZKA - This

morning, we board our motor coach for Mass at the Convent of the Divine Mercy at Lagiewniki. Following Mass, we will see the famous image of the Merciful Jesus and the relics of St. Faustina and her tomb. We then proceed to Nowa Huta, the site where St. John Paul II gave his speech opposing communism. The cornerstone of this church is from St. Peter's Basilica! Afterwards, we proceed to Wieliczka, famous for its salt mine, and a UNESCO heritage site. Following a break for lunch on own, we visit the upper levels of the mine, where we view chapels with altar pieces and statues all hand carved from salt by the Polish miners. This is an experience you will never forget. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Thursday, April 23 - Day 7 - KRAKOW/ WADOWICE/PRAGUE - Today, we

depart for Wadowice, the birthplace of Pope St. John Paul II, where we celebrate Mass at the parish church of the Holy Father. Afterwards, we continue our journey west into the Czech Republic and the beautiful city of Prague, with a stop along our route for lunch on our own. We arrive in beautiful Prague in time for dinner and overnight at our hotel. (B,D)

Friday, April 24 - Day 8 - PRAGUE – This morning, we begin our tour of Prague and view the Basilica of St. George and its adjacent convent, Wladislav Hall, Golden Lane, Loreto Church, with remarkable treasury and Carillon playing every hour. We also visit St. Vitus Cathedral and the tomb of St. Wenceslaus, as well as the head of St. Luke. We visit the famous Infant Jesus of Prague at the Church of Our Lady of Victory, where we celebrate Mass. After lunch on our own, our afternoon includes a tour of Prague's Old Town with its Astronomical clock, Jewish Quarter and Charles Bridge. We conclude our day at our hotel with dinner and overnight. (B,D)

Saturday, April 25 - St. Mark - Day 9 -

PRAGUE - Today, we have a free day to explore Prague, enjoy the beautiful architecture, shopping or simply relax in the beauty that makes Prague such a popular destination. We enjoy lunch on our own and return to our hotel later in the day [Mass will be scheduled after 4:00 pm], in time for our "farewell" dinner and overnight at our hotel. (B,D)

Sunday, April 26 - Day 10 - PRAGUE/ USA - This morning, we transfer to the airport for our flight home, arriving the same day with memories of a lifetime.

TOTAL TOUR PRICE: The tour price is based on airfare, cruise, land rates and rates of exchange in effect June 7, 2025. All rates are subject to change without prior notice. Should the rates go up or down, an adjustment would be made prior to departure. Refunds CANNOT be granted for any accommodations, services or events that are not used nor if you deviate from the tour. If fewer than 25 pilgrims participate a price adjustment may be necessary.

PASSPORT AND VISA REQUIREMENTS: A valid passport is required. At the time of printing, U.S. citizens holding valid passports DO NOT REQUIRE visas. Passport MUST be valid until October 26, 2026, or later. Citizens of countries other than U.S. - please contact the consulate of the country or countries being visited to determine visa requirements.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: International flight reservations are being held on Lufthansa and Austrian Airlines. No stopovers are permitted. Any changes after ticket is issued carries a mandatory charge of \$200. Once the tickets are issued, they are NON-TRANSFERABLE AND NON-REFUNDABLE. Any requests to change a ticket once issued will incur a reissue fee of \$200 plus any fare differential will apply. Cancellation of air seat within 90 days of departure will incur a \$200 penalty. **DOMESTIC AIRFARE:** For those who make domestic air arrangements to the originating city of this tour, your tour host and Unitours strongly recommend the purchase of tickets that can be changed without heavy fees and penalties as international flight schedules are always <u>subject to change</u>.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Specially selected hotels based on twin occupancy with private bath. Single Room supplement of \$715 will be charged where requested and available. If you do not have a roommate and Unitours is unable to arrange one, you will be billed for the single room supplement. All singles are subject to availability.

MEALS: Breakfast and Table D' Hote dinners are provided daily except where noted in the itinerary. An extra charge will be made when coffee, tea or other beverages are not included in the menu of the day with the dinner meal.

TIPS AND TAXES: Tips and taxes normally appearing on hotel and restaurant bills as service are included, as are all government and local taxes on hotels and meals, porterage of one suitcase per person. DEPOSITS AND CANCELLATIONS: A deposit of \$500 is required to secure reservations. Any balance is to be paid in full no later than 60 days before departure of tour. 45 days of departure.) Reservations made within 60 days of departure must include full payment. Amex, Discover, Visa and MasterCard are accepted with signed reservation form. Final payments will be applied to same credit card on final payment due date. Cancellations made from time of reservation to within 61 days prior to departure - \$400 administration fee (charged to deposit) plus any air penalties noted above. In the event of a cancellation from 60 to 31 days prior to departure -\$400 administration fee plus up to 50% of the land cost, plus any air penalties noted above. No refund for cancellations received within 30 days of departure. All cancellation and refund claims must be in writing to Unitours, Inc.
